

From the Pastor's Desk

My dearest sisters and brothers in Christ,

We've spent a couple months talking about living into the new vision of Holy Trinity. We are to be a difference: seeking, partnering, responding. If we could reach these actions words, we would be the perfect followers of Christ. The hard part of words on paper is manifesting those by our actions matching the words.

We are stewards of God's love who live-out this task gratefully. David Marz, Senior Pastor of Spirit of Joy Lutheran Church in Gilbert, Arizona, writes, "Inviting people to generously respond to the gospel of God (God's love) is stewardship! As stewards of all God's blessings, we are first receivers of what God has already done. Then in trust and faith, we accompany the active work of God in the world through our giving."

One task in living-out our vision is to support the ministries of Holy Trinity through our giving. In a few weeks, December 14th to be exact, we will have our yearly budget meeting. It will be revealed that the annual expenses- the money needed to gratefully live out vision, the money needed to share faith and service with one another and the residents of Catasauqua- is estimated to be \$244,150. The estimated income- the actual money we give to the wholeness of mission- is estimated to be \$196,000. We need to pray hard about our giving response.

God has created us and blessed us with more than we could ever imagine. The manifestation of our vision statement is our lively response to God's abundant giving. While we give abundantly and generously to special requests like Clothing Help for the Homeless or Summer Feeding Programs or Hearts for Hearts, we also need to give generously, out of our abundance, to our everyday expenses like heat, paper, and insurance. Again, I am saying we need to pray hard about our giving response.

I will give a piece of reality. I hope that you do not only strive to live into this reality but that you pray upon what God is calling us into out of God's abundant giving. There are roughly 150 giving units at Holy Trinity. If each giving unit would commit to adding \$5 a week to their already given offering- you know what you gave last year. If you add \$5 a week to that we would meet the annual expenses. If God puts in your heart a more generous offering, we could do more sharing of faith and service. We could expand upon feeding programs, upon worshipful experiences, upon fellowship gatherings, and upon programs for the community like Big Brothers/Big Sisters.

The ministries coming out of Holy Trinity because of our recognition of God's abundance and our response to that have been amazing. Let us give abundantly for next year's ministries. Let's be generous, sharing children of God, as we recognize the abundance we have because of God. Please take time to pray to God: praise God for the things God has provided and ask God how we are to respond to those provisions.

TURNING POINT RECYCLING PROGRAM

"Please place donated cell phones in the basket on the glass table in the back of the sanctuary or in the familiar box in the hallway outside the fellowship hall. By recycling your used SMART PHONES, CELL PHONES, AND TABLETS, you are supporting a Zero Landfill program as well as supporting Turning Point."

Did you know? The Lions Club collects used eyeglasses (they don't need the cases) for areas in the world where glasses are unheard of luxury. The Lions have the glasses polished and shipped to optical missions around the world. The glasses are spread out, and the community members try on the glasses until they find a pair that helps. Can you imagine? Your used glasses can be dropped off in the box at the Whitehall Public Library, or here at Holy Trinity in the small basket in the "giving area" in the back of the sanctuary or in the basket in the hallway outside the fellowship hall.

REDNER'S SAVE-A-TAPE program: If you shop at Redner's please be sure to get a Save-a-Tape card at the customer service desk. (It's free!) When you make a purchase, give your card to the cashier to scan. The total points will show at the bottom of your receipt. Place your receipts in the basket in the "giving area" in the back of the sanctuary so the points can be submitted. Holy Trinity receives 1% of the purchase (excluding milk, tobacco, and tax). At \$1 for every \$100 spent, this can add up to a significant contribution toward Bear Creek camperships!

At any time, you can give donations to the "**Pastor's Discretionary Fund**". This fund is used to give temporary financial assistance to people of our congregation and community when a sudden need arises. You may send contributions to the church or place them in the offering plate on Sunday mornings. Please mark your checks or envelopes "Pastor's Discretionary Fund".

The November 17, 2025 meeting was led by **Janis Charvala**, with 37 members in attendance. We welcomed our speaker **Beverly Bradley** from Cops 'n' Kids.

Devotions: **Barb Fister's** devotions centered around being thankful. She had several women read Bible verses about thankfulness and then showed us a Thankful Tree on a poster. She passed around leaf post-its on which we could write what we were each thankful for in our lives. Our speaker was **Beverly Bradley, president of Cops'n'Kids of the Lehigh Valley, Inc.** Beverly told us that her original goal for distributing books was 1,000 but as a result of the kindness and commitment of the entire community, the award-winning Cops 'n' Kids Children's Literacy Program has distributed **more than a million free books** thus far—**1,262,610** to be exact. This program pairs children (focusing on pre-school through middle school) with new or gently used books that have been donated by individuals and organizations from throughout the Lehigh Valley. In many cases, the books are the first the children have to keep as their own. This is all made possible as a result of an amazing “spirit of giving” in our community. The children, most likely, never had a book of their own and this has made a lasting impression on the lives of many, many children.




