From the Pastor's Desk

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

CHANGES IN ATTITUDE, CHANGES IN GRATITUDE

We are about into embark into the season of gratitude. It is the time of the year when reflect on the moments and experiences which fill us with a thought of overwhelming thanks. The Visioning people, who had a chance to sit and dream, have decided to start living into our vision by kicking off the first word of "seeking" by honoring some long traditions and lifting some new ideas in our midst. The "seeking" part of living will be bookended with an All-Saints Sunday celebration.

At Holy Trinity we seek the lost, the found, the proud, the humble, the poor, the rich, the homeless, the housed, the old, the young, the one looking for a new community, the one comfortable in their community, the LGBTQ person, the straight person. We seek anyone who is willing to be a little vulnerable and join a group who desires to praise God and be in relationships with others. All of these people we see as vitally important to the whole. Therefore, we share words of gratitude as they enter into our space. It does not matter to us if they enter as official members or not. It matters that they feel welcome, safe, and valued. Members of the staff, the Homeless Talk Team, and the Property Team have redesigned the fellowship hallway to send this message to our visitors.

We seek Morning Glories (woman's group and my most favorite model of worshipping and honoring God), Five Loaves Workers (a group dedicated to feeding, fellowship, and fun as they prep, serve, and distribute- well just about everything imaginable), Worship and Music Creators (minds that discuss how we worship God on Sunday mornings), Faith Formation Explorers (people who volunteer to teach young church members on Sunday mornings, who teach middle schoolers that there is a different way to live, who teach good action over proper wording), Social Ministry Members (those of us who see the need to walk with others in times of struggle, sorrow, and disappointment).

We seek phone calls, text messages, and emails from you as you envision yourself living into the vision of Holy Trinity. Messages which sound a lot like, "how can I fit in and start living. For, we live into the seeking part of the vision by actively connecting to one another-whether the other is a member, a visitor, or someone we meet in the streets.

As we go through November and start to recognize seeking moments, we will center on our source of seeking, on a God who yearns for a relationship with us. We will continue to practice yellow prayer cards (found on the offering table and shared during worship services). 

TURNING POINT RECYCLING PROGRAM

By recycling your used SMART PHONES, CELL PHONES, AND TABLETS, you are supporting a Zero Landfill program as well as supporting Turning Point."

<u>Did you know?</u> The Lions Club collects used eyeglasses (they don't need the cases) for areas in the world where glasses are unheard of luxury. The Lions have the glasses polished and shipped to optical missions around the world. The glasses are spread out, and the community members try on the glasses until they find a pair that helps. Can you imagine? Your used glasses can be dropped off in the box at the Whitehall Public Library, or here at Holy Trinity in the small basket in the "giving area" in the back of the sanctuary or in the basket in the hallway outside the fellowship hall.

REDNER'S SAVE-A-TAPE program: If you shop at Redner's please be sure to get a Save-a-Tape card at the customer service desk. (It's free!) When you make a purchase, give your card to the cashier to scan. The total points will show at the bottom of your receipt. Place your receipts in the basket in the "giving area" in the back of the sanctuary so the points can be submitted. Holy Trinity receives 1% of the purchase (excluding milk, tobacco, and tax). At \$1 for every \$100 spent, this can add up to a significant contribution toward Bear Creek camperships!

At any time, you can give donations to the "**Pastor's Discretionary Fund**". This fund is used to give temporary financial assistance to people of our congregation and community when a sudden need arises. You may send contributions to the church or place them in the offering plate on Sunday mornings. Please mark your checks or envelopes "Pastor's Discretionary Fund".

The Five Loaves & Two Fish Team was also back in business...and will be looking for volunteers to help with upcoming events. The Spaghetti Dinner raised \$950 for the Ripple Community. **Next up: Pancake Breakfast and Bake Sale on Saturday, November 22nd from 8:30-11am.** Arrive any time during the breakfast...no tickets or reservations needed to enjoy a delicious meal! This by-donation event benefits the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, which helps meet emergency needs of our church family and Catasauqua neighbors. And starting Sunday, November 2nd through Sunday, December1st...our annual Ingathering of gifts for area service providers. The tags on the Angel Tree in the entryway represent more than just items to buy and send "somewhere". They are wished for and, sometimes, much-needed items. They are *gifts*, for *people...F*or children or teens away from their homes during the Christmas season, and struggling for some control in their out-of-control lives...For men traveling the road from homelessness and often alcoholism or drug addiction to a productive life with the help of the Allentown Rescue Mission...For nearly-forgotten elderly residents of Gracedale nursing home...For the homeless served during the day by the Ripple Community and during these cold nights at the Warming Station...for the women recovering their lives at Bloom for Women, after being trafficked. *People*. That's who your Angel Tree gifts will go to. To people. Please take one or more tags from the Angel Tree (these are the items we have made a commitment to provide) or a wish list at the base of the tree (items needed in general by these agencies). Be sure to tighten a bulb on the tree to let your light shine! Items can be placed in the large "gift boxes" at the back of the sanctuary...deadline to drop off items is December 1st! If you choose a tag for an individual child at KidsPeace, please let Diane Czar or Cheryl Kneiss know - we'll get the details to you about the child's wish list as soon as we receive them. Thank you as always for your incredible generosity in supporting this Mission District-wide ministry.



Whether you love it or hate it, football season is in full swing! So is the countdown to Christmas...and so is our ongoing SCRIP gift card fundraiser!!

In case you're a newcomer to the game, here are the rules we're playing by for SCRIP cards:

- The second Sunday of each month is the deadline for our regular monthly order. We pay \$11 shipping for each order, so we try to combine all orders into one submission each month, to maximize Holy Trinity's profits.
- The monthly order is submitted the evening of the deadline. If you give us an order after that day, it will be held until the next month's order.
- Cards are delivered to you at church the 3rd Sunday of the month. We usually receive them 3 days after we place the order, so if you need them before Sunday, we can make arrangements for earlier delivery or pick-up. If you live in Catty, we deliver the cards before Sunday.
- Some of the profits are rolled into an inventory of the most popular cards, available for immediate purchase. After Christmas, we hope to reduce our inventory so that more funds are available for faith formation-related expenditures.
- Ya gotta shop anyway...why not give back to your church while doing your shopping, dining, home improvements, and gift-giving? You'll spend the same amount as you would using cash or a credit card, and you'll be supporting Holy Trinity's faith formation activities and scholarship program via the rebate that the SCRIP program gives to HT for each card purchased!

So get in the game! Think Thanksgiving and Christmas grocery shopping; Black Friday sales; Christmas gift shopping; and gift cards for those hard-to-shop-for people on your list, employees, teachers, and bosses. Next order deadlines are Sunday November 9th and December 7rd (one week early due to longer Christmas shipping times). Why not let SCRIP save you a trip for those ever-popular gift cards on your family's Christmas wish lists?!

Maybe this will inspire us all... The profit from the September, October, November, and December SCRIP orders will be donated to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund! September orders raised \$173 and October orders raised \$140 for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund!!!

Call or text Diane (610-739-6006) for card requests...or see Joe before or after 10:30am worship with orders or to purchase cards that we have in stock. IOUs are welcome! Yellow order forms are available from the rack in the back of the sanctuary, or you can see or call us to place an order. Orders can be given to Joe, or placed in the offering plate - after all, the rebates you raise are an offering to God!

LITTLE BY LITTLE, A LITTLE BECOMES A LOT



Out of the \$1500 raised at this year's event, we determined that \$500 should be kept in the Youth account to continue our monthly commitment and special gifts to our sponsored child, Tsepang. These cats can be TNR (Trap, Neuter, Return) stray cats, feral cats, cats transferred from the South and even exotic cats from Kuwait. They are all foster-based and live in private homes until adopted. You can find these cats on their website (www.StartingOverAnimalRescue.org) or on Facebook, Petco and the Coal Cats Café in Tamaqua, PA. There is an application that must be completed and if approved a \$150.00 fee is charged but that includes the neutering, vaccinations, feline leukemia testing, dental, if necessary, and any special surgeries. 
